“Project Readiness” is a new early intervention program model. This program incorporates current program requirements, technology, and a special emphasis on social skills and preschool readiness.

“Project Readiness” closely models a preschool environment affording students the opportunity to engage regularly with other peers. Students will get to know each other as well as their teachers. They will be provided an abundance of experience in utilizing pragmatic language, turn taking, hand raising, sharing, and more.

PROGRAMS

- All TUT programs are based on the science of ABA (Applied Behavior Analysis)
- The treatment has decades of research supporting it's efficacy.
- Based on it's effectiveness, some states have mandated insurance companies to cover this healthcare expense.

BCBA SUPERVISION



BCBA supervision of all programs ensures oversight of all assessments and reporting, and approval of all programs and program materials. Programs are language based focusing on acquisition and maintenance of new skills.

PROGRAM MAKE UP

- Full day tuition based program: 8:30—2:30 pm
- 15 to 20 hours covered by insurance for direct ABA instruction
- Remaining hours are similar to the cost daycare or preschool
- Extended hours available for working families.

TEACHING METHODS

The programs utilize a variety of evidence based teaching methods based in the science of ABA including:

- Discrete Trial
- Direct Instruction
- Video Modeling
- Audio Modeling
- Incidental Teaching

INCIDENTAL TEACHING

Programs focus on:

- Social Skills
- Self-help skills
- Play skills
- Pragmatic language
- Joint attention

REPORTING

- Parents are provided with quarterly reports on student progress
- Parents are also provided on-line access to some/all of their child's mastered program targets for continued generalization at home.
